Present a presentation of their product • Evaluate how your group did in the full project. How successful was the group in achieving its aims? • What do we need money for when you're at school, university, have a young family or retired? Who pays for school, hospitals police etc? Who pays for your pension? Who pays if your house burns down? • What does rich and poor mean? Why do some people have more money than others? Why do some countries have more money than others? What is the role of charities?
