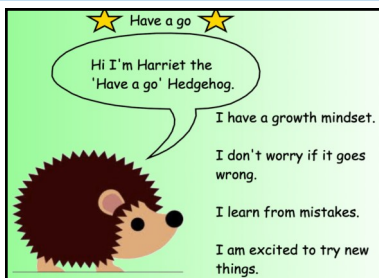

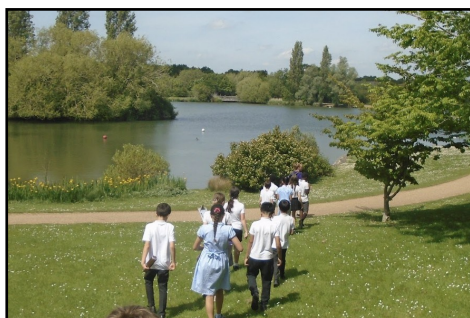

The Superb Seven, a year six group of fundraisers are having a fund raiser in support of the British Dyslexia Association on Tuesday after school.

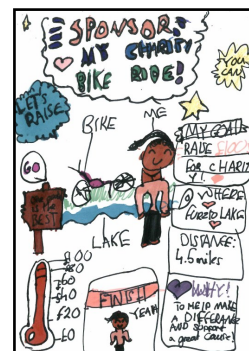
