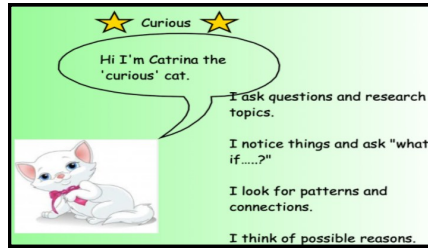


Learning Behaviours

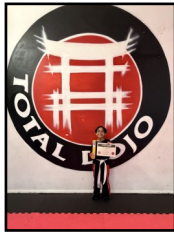
