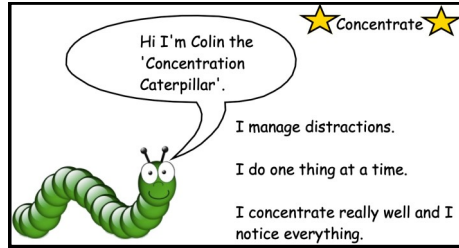


Learning Behaviours

Joules Class

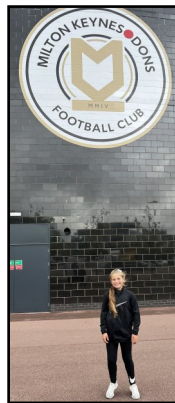

You embody our school motto, Nil Satis Nisi Optimum - "Nothing but the best is good enough" - and for that, we thank you wholeheartedly.

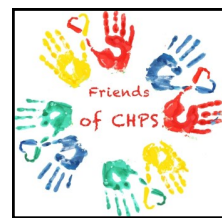
