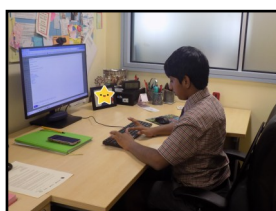
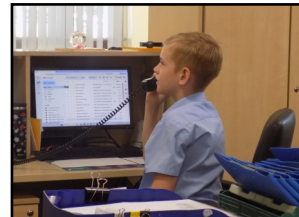
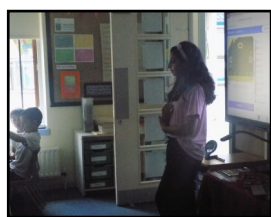
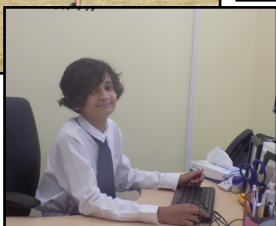
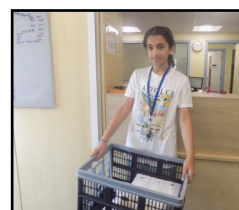
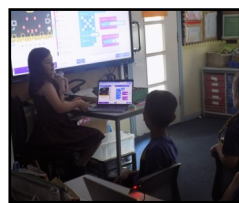
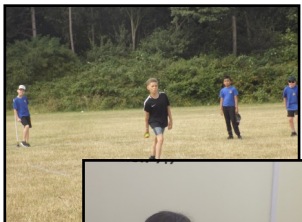
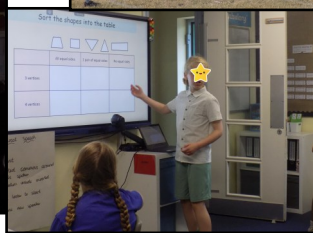
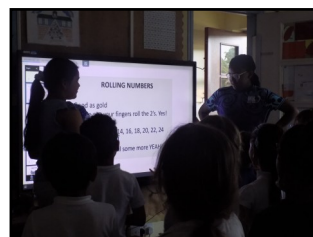
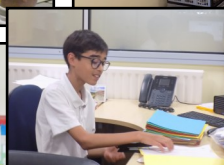
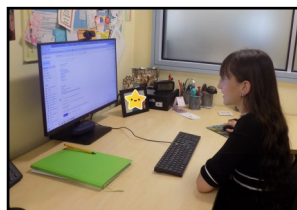
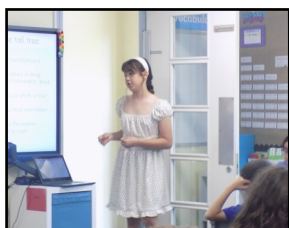


### Year 6 Takeover 2026

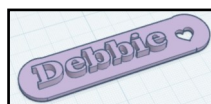
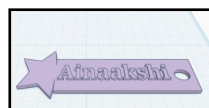
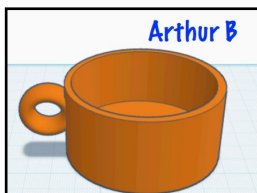


## Computing

## Great British Summer Savings
