Staff stayed behind to work on stalls, we had visits from ex members of staff, and former students who were still as respectful and



I am creative.


I let my imagination go.

Online Safety Byte

Here's some advice from Childnet about giving devices this Christmas

A great way to ensure your child starts their experience in the safest way is to get the device set up before you give it to them. Once you've researched the device, you can put in place some safety settings and parental controls to help you feel comfortable with your child using it. If you are gifting a second hand device to your child, you can make sure that the device has been reset to factory settings before you give it as a gift. This means that any apps or settings that are already on the device have been removed.

On Android devices you can restrict what content can be downloaded in Google Play. On Apple devices you can go into Content & Privacy Restrictions in Screen Time to help block and limit specific apps and restrict explicit content, purchases and downloads.

Although setting these parental controls is a key step towards keeping your child safe online, it is important that this is not done in place of open conversations.

Knife Angel Visit at the MK Stadium

The Knife Angel symbolizes how knife crime is very serious and dangerous. It weighs about 6 tons and is made of roughly 100,000 knives. It was made in 2017.

I is made from a variety of knives/weapons apart from its face and hands. We found it interesting how its face was distraught and it hands were poised in a way that asked why people would do such things? On the barriers there were sheets of laminated cards encouraging people to not commit knife crime and pictures of people who died be-

cause of it. We learnt about knife crime, and played a quick-decision game to show how we think quickly under pressure.
