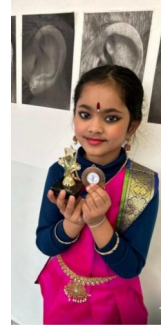

10. Turn off your device

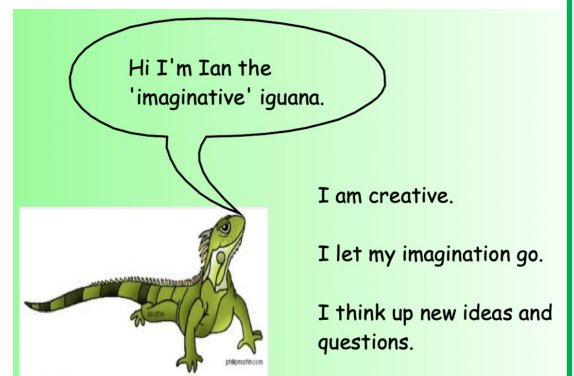


Learning Behaviours
