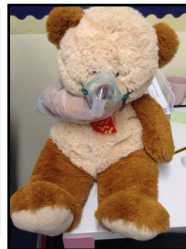
William from Edison class earned his stage 2 swimming certificate this week.

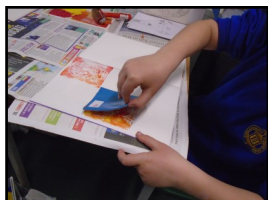


This a very difficult competition as we are competing against much larger schools, so we did a great job achieving what we did. Well done team!

Parsons Class

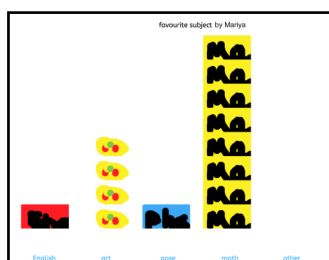
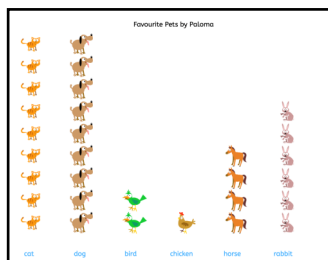
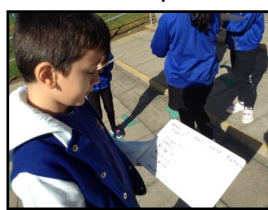
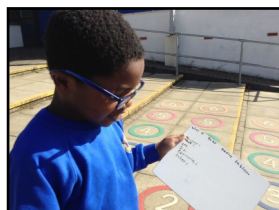
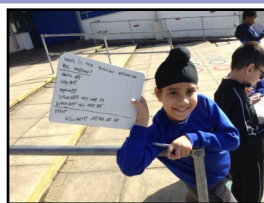

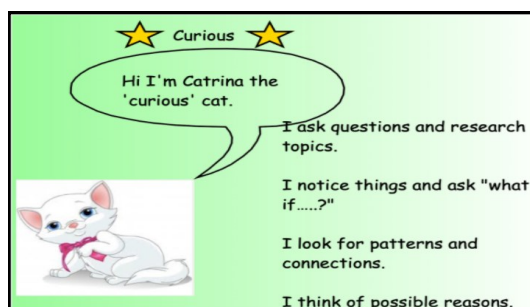
Computing

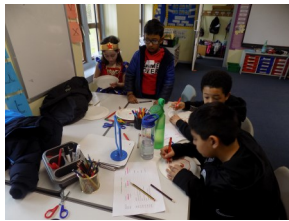
