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



Learning Behaviours

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
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At Caroline Haslett Primary School, we have 8 characters that help us remember the skills of an effective learner in all of our lessons.

Online Safety Byte

87% of Year 2 say they have agreed rules at home about how they spend their time online. Do you?

CHPS Top Tips

Sit down with your child and agree some rules around how long they can spend on certain devices and when they can do certain activities such as talk to friends or play games. For example, you might agree with them they can video call with friends, but only if you're in the room, or you might let them play games in the main family room at the weekends with their school friends. Involving your child is in this process will encourage them to think about how they spend time online and help them develop good online habits in the future. Different rules will work for different families, but often work best when agreed together as a family. That way, your child can share things

like how long each game lasts which is helpful to know when agreeing time limits. It can help to write down any new rules together as a family, so you can come back to them later. Remember, it is important for adults to follow rules too!
