I think of possible reasons.




Some of our Digital Leaders have entered the Bedford Branch Cyber Challenge.

In Year 2, we have been understanding age-rating systems for games. We explored the legal requirements of PGEI ratings and why games have ratings. The children all created a game cover using Google


