
## Wellbeing Cafe



A warm welcome to Mrs Cleary who is a new TA in our Foundation classes and to Mrs Khan who will be joining our TA team on Monday.




The children gained a Discover Arts award and celebrated an ancient tradition and its potential to empower people and enhance lives. The dancers were particularly impressed with the

A big thank you to the staff that went into the stocks!!


### Obstacle Course

This was a popular sports game this year. We kept a record of children's times, so that we could have a winner per year group:


