

# Empowering children to make a difference.

This academic year CHPS have registered for a Social Impact Award.

The award is designed to educate, inspire and empower the next generation of change-makers, teaching children about the world and the impact and change they can make.



In order for CHPS to achieve the award, we need to have logged at least one social action badge per child.

There are 12 social actions that can be achieved. Every social action, no matter how big or small, makes a difference. You are probably doing many already, but as the benefits of social action to children are huge, we hope that you take on the challenge to do as many as possible!

These are the 12 social actions that you can gain an award for:

Volunteering Making a speech Raising awareness Protesting Making a poster Petitioning Writing a letter Fundraising Organising and event Donating Starting a club Changing your behaviour

Events and activities will be taking place for children to gain awards in school, but we are also keen for children to be creative and inspiring outside school. They can share the impact they have by bringing in evidence (that they have achieved since the Autumn Term) to share with their class so that we can be awarded badges in school.

Examples of evidence may be in the form of a photo, certificate, letter. The badges will be awarded in the form of tokens that will be collected and displayed in school as a collective. Certificates will be awarded termly.

The first token in school has been awarded to Matthew for Raising Awareness.

Matthew has been making sign language videos and sharing with the school.

We had our first planning meeting of the new term and it was lovely to catch up with some familiar faces and welcome new members too.


The Autumn/Winter term will be packed with 'favourites' in terms of events and activities for the children and we have some possible new ideas in the mix as well. Watch this space!
