Winners this week were Volta class!



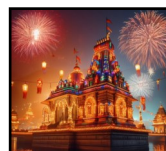

We shall be having a men's health wellbeing cafe in the spring term.

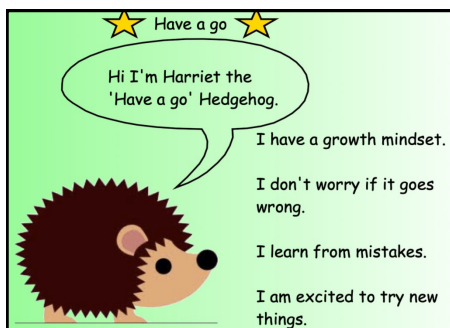

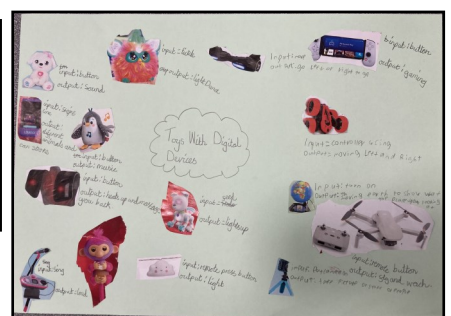
