We first found out about Prehistoric cave art, which is dated from around 10,000 to 20,000 years ago, before investigating the amazing modern-day charcoal artist Judith

Ann Braun, who creates her artwork using charcoal dust. We then created our own charcoal art based on the Prehistoric hand paintings which cover the Cave of the Hands, in Argentina. We enjoyed experimenting with our charcoal by applying different pres-

sures, smudging and shading, to create our final piece.

some rangoli patterns and learning more about Diwali in their classes.


Diwali this year fell on the 12th November.


