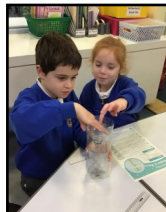
Year 4 Orienteering

Filtering and Monitoring

In order to comply with the 2023 DFE guidance on filtering and monitoring standards, and Keeping Children Safe in Education 2023, the school now has a rigorous filtering and monitoring system in place that ensures children cannot access any unsuitable online content in school.

It also enables us to monitor the children's online searches to help us further in keeping them safe. This monitoring system works when children are logged in using their school email address wherever they are. Alerts are created enabling staff to see the images the child is viewing. This helps to support your efforts to keep our children safe online.

Children's Mental Health Week

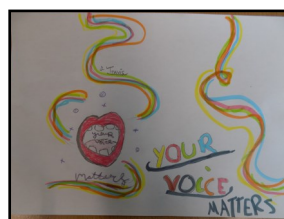

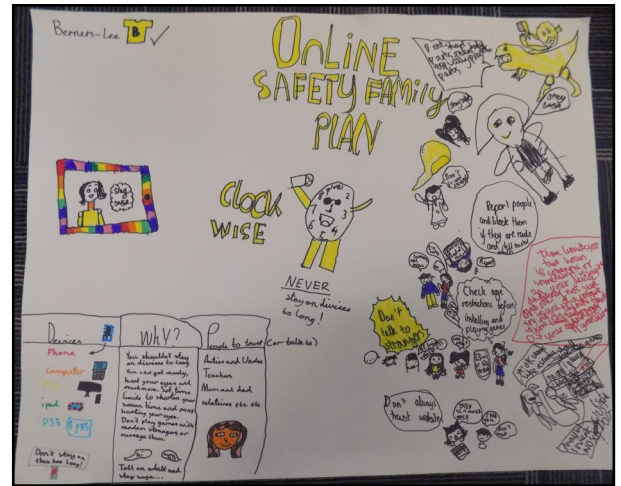

Here is the winning poster, from the children in Berners-Lee house.

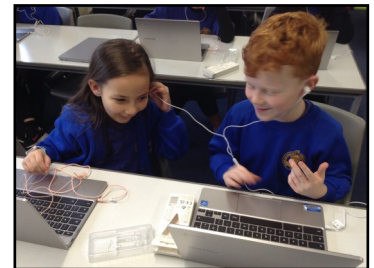

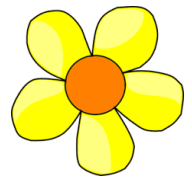
Year 4 Computing
