Considerate Parking

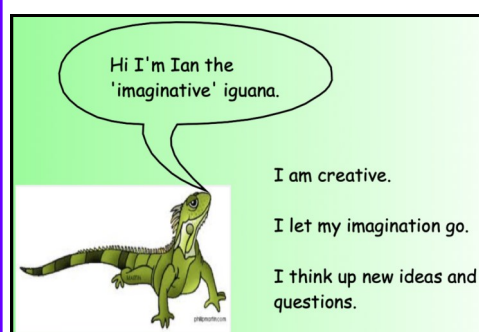
Please park considerately when using the car park. We have had complaints about people using the disabled bays and about parking cars up on the pathways, making it very difficult for people to walk their children safely to school.

Year 4

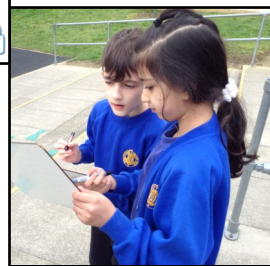
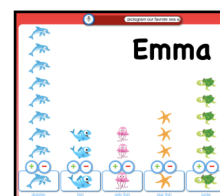

Computing

Year 2 have been exploring what data means and how it can be collected in the form of a tally chart. The children have learnt the term 'attribute' and they used this to help them organise data. We collected data and presented it in the form of pictograms.

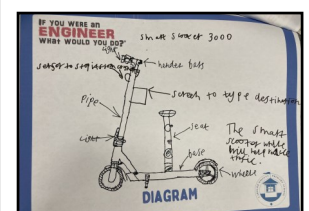
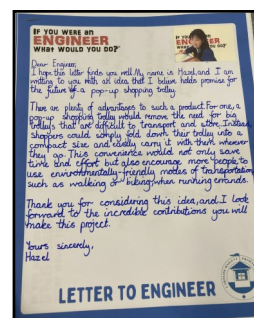
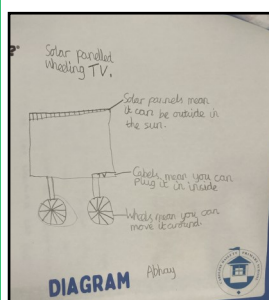


STEM

World Book Day at Caroline Haslett

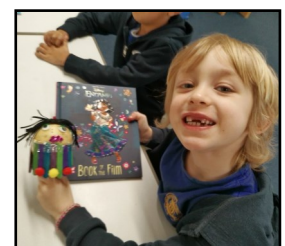
The children were encouraged to make a potato model of their favourite story book character.
