Year 3 Curriculum


Our Whole Class Reading this half term based on the book 'You're a Bad Man. Mr Gum!' bu Andy Stanton.


In English this half term, we will begin by writing a character description, based on Mr Gum We will

then move on to writing a biography on Tarisse King, who is an Aboriginal artist that we will be studuing in our art lessons. Finally, we will debate about whether Mr Gum is a bad man.

As always, we will continue with a strong focus grammar, focusing on skills such as punctuating speech, fronted adverbials [of time] and similes.

Within Maths, our topics this half term will include the measurement of time (including analogue clocks, digital clocks, months and days of the year, and reading timetables), as well as measuring length and calculating perimeter. Please provide your child with many opportunities to tell the time at home and when you are out and about. This half term's target is to tell the time.





In **Science**, we will continue exploring the topic of light, before learning about Forces and Magnets. This topic will give the children opportunities to learn what forces are and how different surfaces affect the motion of an object. We will be exploring how magnets work and identify materials that are magnetic and non-magnetic.



Within ART, we will discover the work of the artist Tarrise King, and produce an oil pastel drawing of a river bed using techniques adopted by Tarrise.

We will then create a collage in the style of Mary Spears' water collages. Next, we will explore reflections in the style of Claude Monet, where we will look at local landscapes by creating observational drawings before painting. This will involve a trip to Furzton lake to inspire our artwork.

Crowther and Maybach will continue their work with Miss Hart in Computing. In our unit Networks and the Internet, the children will develop their understanding of digital devices, with an initial focus on inputs, processes, and outputs. We will start by comparing digital and non-digital devices, before introducing them to computer networks that include network infrastructure devices like routers and switches.

Our PSHE lessons will focus on understanding what taking responsibilities means and how to make wise choices. Our lessons will encourage the children to recognise

different ways we can deal with worries and explore ways of supporting each other through circle time discussions and whole class debates.



Within RE, we will explore the story behind the Passover celebration, before investigating the similarities between Passover and Easter



In **French**, we will be consolidating our understanding of the different colours and naming family members, as well as the different body parts. During the unit of "Look at Me" we will learn to answer simple questions and give basic information about everyday events and about ourselves.

Finally, in **Geography**, we will begin to learn about rivers. We will focus on some different rivers in the UK, and we will look at the different parts of a river. The children will also make their own rivers using recyclable materials.

Whilst listening to your child read, focus on the new vocabulary they come across, but also question their understanding of the text - can they find an answer within the text? Can they use the text to help support an idea, or an answer to a question you have asked?
