

**Knowledge****Pablo Picasso 1881-1973**

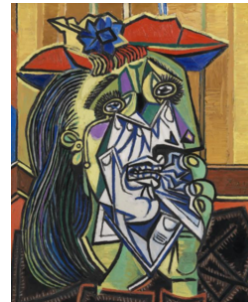
Picasso was a Spanish artist who lived in Paris, France. He was brilliant at drawing. He loved to experiment with colour. He had times where he first made lots of sad, blue paintings followed by lots of happier paintings using warmer colours. He invented Cubism.

**Cubism**

In Cubist artwork, the artist breaks an object into different shapes. The paintings are not realistic.

**Paul Klee 1879-1940**

Klee focused on using colour. He often painted a watercolour background and then created a simple line drawing on top.

**Activities**

- Look at examples of portraits by famous artists, and draw a self-portrait with detailed features, selecting appropriate colours.
- Experiment with warm and cold colours using paint and watercolour to express feelings
- Practise using watercolour in the style of Paul Klee
- Use collage materials to make an abstract portrait in the style of Picasso
- Create a final portrait using watercolour and collage

**Vocabulary**

**Portrait** - a picture of one person or a small group of people

**Self-portrait** - a picture of yourself

**Warm colours** - bright colours like yellow, orange, pink and red

**Cold colours** - darker colours like green, blue, indigo and violet

**Collage** - technique of combining objects to make a picture

**Abstract art** - where shapes and colour are used to make an image that everyone sees differently

**Watercolours** - paints that you mix with water

**Watercolour wash** - using paint and water and sweeping the paintbrush across a large surface to create a background

**Sweep** - moving the paintbrush from side to side

**Line drawing** - a drawing created using only simple lines

**Pattern** - when the same image is repeated

**Monochrome** - one colour

**Skills**

- Learn about the work of famous artists
- Develop art and design techniques [using colour, watercolours, collage, line drawing, pattern]
- Experiment with colour mixing and practise brush strokes
- Evaluate their own and others' work
