Cooper was in his first ice hockey tournament at the


weekend in Chelmsford and won the 'spirit of the game award for his attitude and performance. Well done Cooper!

#### **Year 4 Science**

In our science lessons this half term with Mrs Thomson, we have been learning about the digestive system, including teeth. We have found out that enamel is the hard surface which protects our teeth. Sugar in food and drink can lead to plaque and tooth decay, which weaken the enamel. This is why it is so important to brush our teeth twice a day. This week, we conducted an experiment to see what would happen to eggs left in different liquids:

- · Water
- · Coffee
- Coca Cola
- · Orange juice
- Vinegar











The egg shell acts as enamel. We had to predict what we thought was going to happen. We took the eggs out of the liquids after 4 days to see what had happened. We were shocked to see the damage to the eggs that were left in the liquids with a high amount of sugar. We will certainly remember this experiment when it's time to brush our teeth!
