I notice things and ask "what if ...?" I look for patterns and connections.


I think of possible reasons.






Online Safety Byte

In order for CHPS to achieve the award by the end of the year we need to have logged at least one social action badge per child.


The award is designed to educate, inspire and empower the next generation of change-makers, teaching children about the world and the impact and change they can make.







Computing
