We would like to invite all parents/carers to attend this year's school Wellbeing Fair on **Thursday 23rd May from 2-4pm**.


This FREE event will be held in the school hall. We are excited to be welcoming a variety of information stands from services across Milton Keynes to provide support, advice and signposting.




Computing
