
At Caroline Haslett Primary School, we have 8 characters that help us remember the skills of an effective learner in all of our lessons.




Year One



Junior Park Rangers

This week, the Junior Park Rangers delivered assemblies to all the children in school. As well as reporting on the beautiful bluebells that can be seen at Howe Park Wood, they introduced Hedgehog Awareness Week. This runs from 5th - 11th May.



Hedgehogs are really struggling and there are only half the numbers of hedgehogs there were twenty years ago. The reasons that hedgehogs are struggling are because of things like:

- Getting hurt by litter that people have dropped
- Getting run over by cars
- Being poisoned by slug pellets that people use in their gardens
- Not having enough space to live and hibernate in

Hedgehogs are what is called an "Indicator Species" which means that if they are doing well, lots of other animals are doing well too, because they share the same habitat (home), food and environment as other wildlife. If hedgehogs are

not surviving very well this means that other creatures aren't either so there are a few things we can do to help.

We can:

- Make sure we pick up our litter
- Leave piles of dried leaves and sticks for hedgehogs and other wildlife to sleep and hiber-
- Leave out saucers of drinking water, especially if it's sunny and hot
- Ask everyone not to use slug pellets
