



Prior Knowledge	Vocabulary
<p>A river is a physical geographical feature.</p>	<p>Bank - the land at the side of the river.</p>
<p>New Knowledge</p>	<p>Bed - the bottom of a river.</p>
<p>Rivers are split into different stages:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● source ● upper course ● middle course ● lower course ● mouth <p>Rivers flow downhill. They collect water from small streams called tributaries.</p> <p>Erosion and deposition change how rivers look over time.</p> <p>Sediment deposited by a river forms new land.</p> 	<p>Channel - a passage through which something flows.</p> <p>Course - the direction or route.</p> <p>Deposition - when water 'drops off' the rock, sand or soil it is carrying.</p> <p>Erosion - when rock, sand or soil is worn away by water or wind.</p> <p>Meander - a winding part of a river.</p> <p>Mouth - the place where a river or stream enters a larger body of water.</p> <p>River - a channel of water that flows towards an ocean, lake or sea.</p> <p>Sediment - the rock, sand or soil that is 'dropped off' after being carried along a river.</p> <p>Source - a point where something starts.</p>
