

<p>The United Kingdom is made up of 4 countries: England, Scotland, Wales and Northern Ireland. There are 12 regions in the United Kingdom. Ordnance Survey Maps can be read using six figure grid references and agreed symbols.</p>	<p>Agriculture - farming.</p> <p>Arable farming - growing crops.</p> <p>Cattle farming - rearing cows for dairy products and for meat.</p>
<p>New Knowledge</p> <p>The 12 regions of the United Kingdom are split into counties.</p> <p>Scottish counties are called council areas.</p> <p>Economic activities provide people with jobs where they earn money.</p> <p>Economic activities in towns and cities include: services, industry, finance and tourism.</p> <p>Rural economic activities include: arable farming, cattle farming, hill farming, market gardening, forestry, mining, energy and tourism.</p>	<p>County - a part of the United Kingdom that is smaller than a region.</p> <p>Economic activity - how people make money.</p> <p>Finance - a service industry that deals with looking after and lending money.</p> <p>Forestry - growing trees that can be chopped down and sold for their wood.</p> <p>Hill farming - rearing sheep.</p> <p>Industry - an economic activity that involves making products.</p> <p>Manufacturing - industry that involves making products.</p> <p>Market gardening - growing fruit, vegetables and flowers.</p> <p>Mining - rock and minerals are dug up from the ground to be sold.</p> <p>Rural area - an area that doesn't have a lot of buildings, like the countryside.</p>
	<p>Services - economic activities that provide a service, e.g. teaching, hairdressing, and selling goods.</p> <p>Urban area - an area that is a town or city.</p> <p>Tourism - an economic activity that makes money from people visiting an area.</p>
<p>Activities</p> <p>Define economic activities.</p> <p>Identify counties of the United Kingdom, and some of the human and physical features previously studied.</p> <p>Use OS maps, personal knowledge and digital technologies to research economic activities in Milton Keynes and the surrounding areas.</p>
