Netball

Knowledge

- Have an awareness of the rules of a conventional game
- Know when to pass - to keep team possession and make progress towards the goal
- Know how to adapt play to the needs of the game
- Understand tactics
- Begin to understand how to referee

Activities

- Run effectively around players - finding free space to receive a ball
- In small games, use a range of passes, varying speed, height and direction
- Small games with opportunities to referee
- Shoot on target
- Use all skills in a recognised version of the game

Vocabulary

Centre Pass

The first pass used to started the game and restart after every goal that is scored

Offside

When a player makes contact with a part of the court which is not included in her own playing area

Shooting circle

The marked circle which the shooters must land in before attempting to make a goal

Throw-in

Taken where the ball crossed the line to go out of court by any player allowed in that part of the court with both feet behind the line. Ball must be released within 4 seconds.

Obstruction

When a player attempting to defend/intercept the ball travels within 1 metre of the attacking player.

Intercept

When a player regains possession of the ball during a pass by the opposition.

Skills

Consistently show control, precision, technique and fluency when:

- sending a ball - using all types of netball passes in a game situation
- receiving a ball - from all angles
- shooting at a net in a game situation
- catching a ball using both sides of the body
