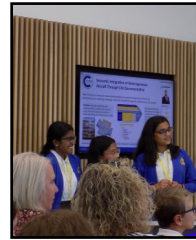




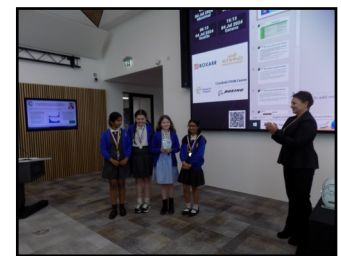
## Digital Leaders

The children created coded educational resources that addressed issues such as online safety and dealing with cyberbullying. Ayla, Bella, Anaisha and Aarya were honoured with a third-place trophy for their outstanding work in the Year 5 category. Year 6 digital leaders, Fatiha, Nidhi, Jaelyn, and Anya, placed first in their category and presented their project to members of the judging panel as well as teachers and children from other schools.

This week, the key stage 2 production club performed their summer show. The children were amazing! The acting, dancing and singing were superb (especially the solos). Well done everybody!

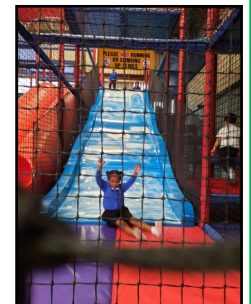

### Rookery Farm Visit

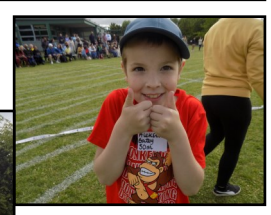

### Year 3

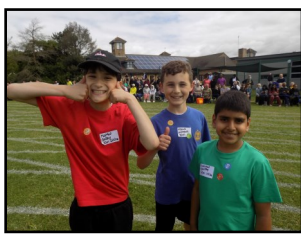
