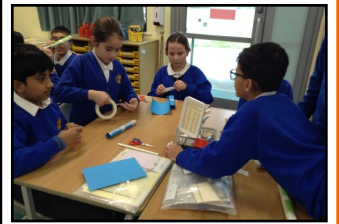
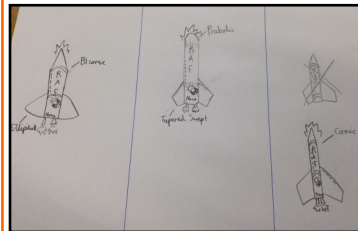

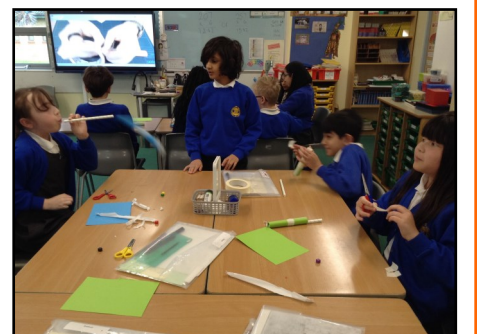


## Learning Behaviours
