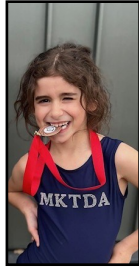

Pupil Achievement

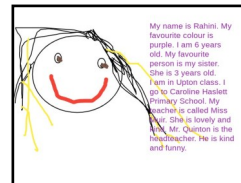

COMPUTER QUALITY MARK

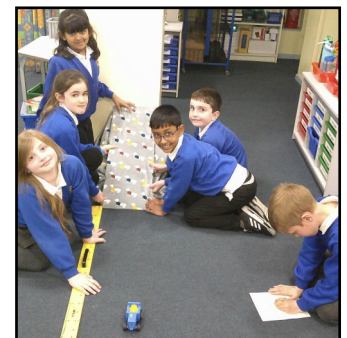

The event culminated in each child presenting a beautiful flower to their loved one as a token of appreciation. A big thank you to all who were able to join us and make the day so memorable.

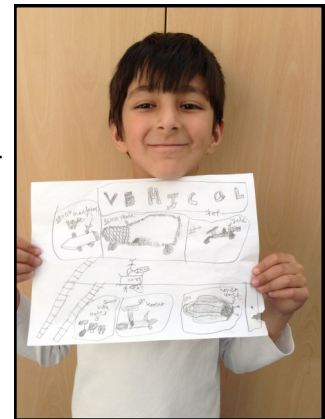
Artwork on the Fridge
