great show of sportsmanship.



Well done to all our athletes. I also want to thank the staff that

swimming lessons!




## Learning Behaviours

the skills of an effective learner in all of our lessons.



Next week's character will be Catrina the Cur-

## Online Safety Byte

### Combat Online Bullying

According to Ofcom's 2022 Media Use and Attitudes report, children are now more likely to be bullied via technology than they are to experience it in person. An alarming 84% of 8 to 17-year-olds who reported being targeted said it had taken place via messaging, social media, online gaming and so on, as opposed to 61% who had been intimidated face-to-face. Here's CHPS's advice for the prevention of online bullying

- 1. Play games together - This will help with discussions and help you to keep an eye on who your child is communicating with.
- 2. Keep Talking - Regular chats with young people are good practice.
- 3. Stay vigilant - observe your child when using technology and just after. Possible early signs of a problem include seeming quiet or withdrawn, angry, jumpy or anxious, or repeatedly checking their phone.
