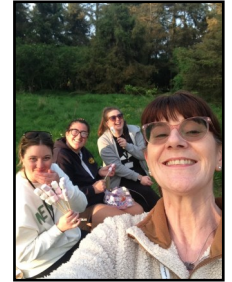




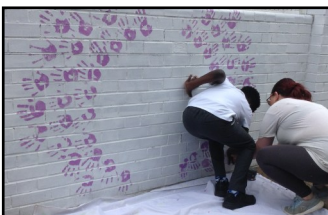

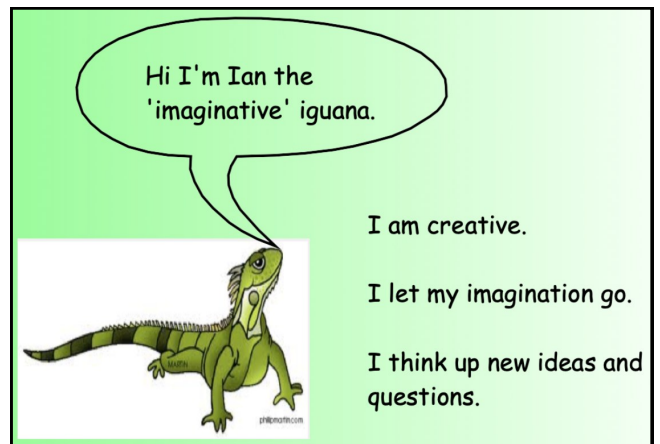


## Learning Behaviours

## Computing

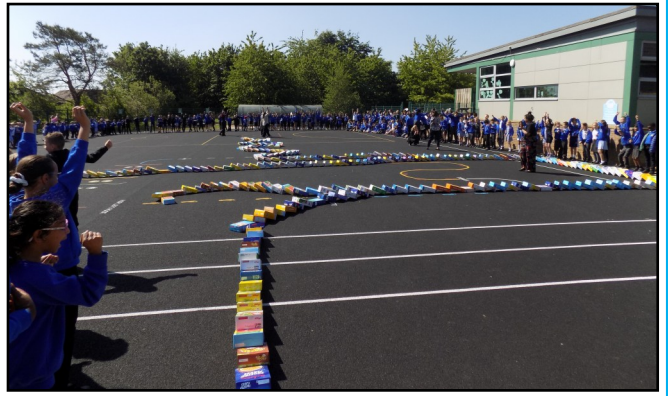

Jaxon from Mayer class competed in the Telford Regional Tumbling competition at the weekend and achieved a Gold medal and a bronze medal with his team.

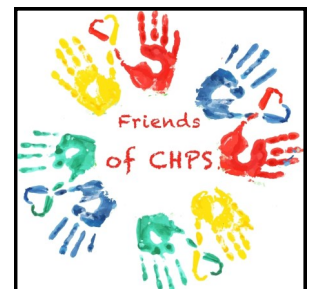
