The character for next week will be Harriet the Have a Go Hedgehog. Encourage your child to practise the skills listed below and be like Harriet.

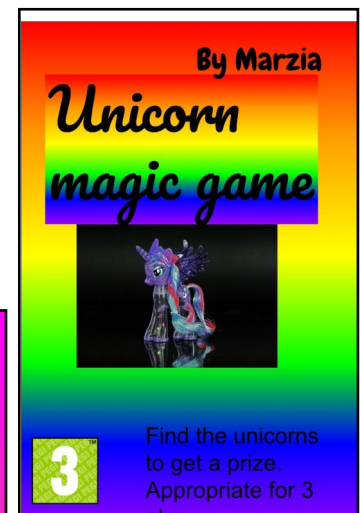
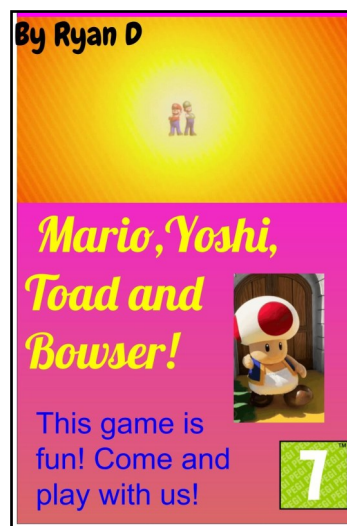
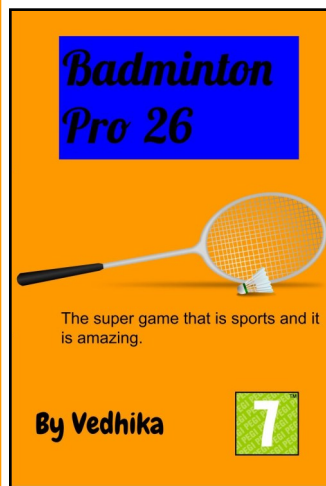

Online Safety Byte

This week, Year 2 have been learning about game age ratings. A game age rating is a classification system that indicates the minimum age at which a game is deemed suitable for play. These ratings help parents decide if a game's content is appropriate for a child's age and maturity level, ensuring they're not exposed to potentially harmful or inappropriate elements. The children designed their own game covers, making sure they were suitable for children their age and included an appropriate PEGI age rating.
