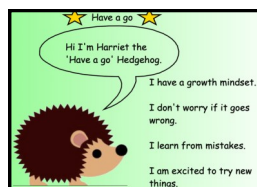
Learning Behaviors

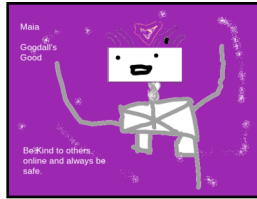
