Paige from Hauksbee class was very proud to represent Milton Keynes in the National Primary Cross Country Final on Saturday 21st March 2026 in Stoneleigh.

It was an amazing experience and achievement for all the children that were put forward to ultimately represent their schools at such a huge event. Year 6 girls were tasked with 2700 metres (about 1.7 miles) over a very challenging course!
